



## Netivon High School Programs of Chizuk Amuno Congregation New Learning Opportunities for 2009-2010



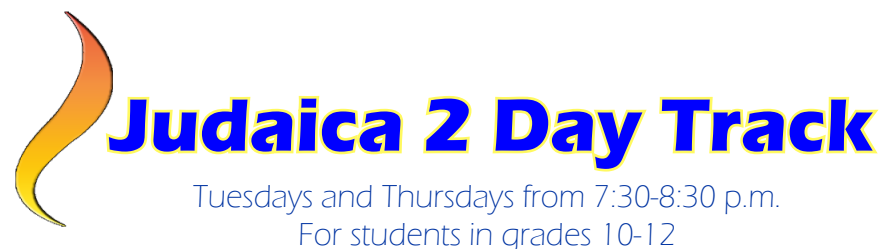

Join an exciting new pilot program in the Netivon High School program. Our tradition teaches that each of us has the capacity to change the course of our world. This is the mission of **Netzah—Netivon Tzedakah and Hesed** program. Through intensive engaging classroom explorations, with expert Judaic and Social Work staff, our participants discover the rich tradition of social justice in Judaism. These classroom experiences will be matched with meaningful ongoing social service projects in our Baltimore community. The Hebrew word **Netzah** means “eternity”—*Join us in this pilot program as we make a lasting impact on our society.*

Limit: 12 participants

### Schedule:

**Netzah** students will meet during 10-12 grade Judaica elective classes on Tuesday evenings and then participate in weekly social service projects on Sunday mornings. The social service projects are a required component of the program—a schedule will be presented to the participants at the beginning of the school year.

### 2 Day track schedule:

First period: Judaica electives (separate for Tuesday and Thursday)  
Second period: Judaica 2 Day class with Leslie Rosen

### Class description: Four Lenses on Eight Stories

A unique way of studying Jewish texts and stories through several different media: not only reading/discussion, but also art, music, drama, and creative writing.

You do NOT need to be an artist, or a musician, or an actor, or a writer (but if you're pretty interested in any one of these, even better) – you just need to be open to exploration of possibilities (yours and the text's), creativity, thinking, and fun.

We will read eight great Jewish stories (plus one which we produce “reader's theatre style”) – taken from the Bible all the way through the late 20th century – and then challenge ourselves to explore characters, themes, images, and story lines in creative ways.
